1. On May 25, 2007, you submitted on behalf of Bridgeport Energy, LLC, ISO New England Inc., Richard Blumenthal, Attorney General for the State of Connecticut, the Connecticut Department of Public Utility Control, the Connecticut Municipal Electric Energy Cooperative, and the Connecticut Office of Consumer Counsel (collectively, “Settling Parties”), an uncontested offer of settlement resolving all issues in the above-referenced proceeding. On June 4, 2007, the Commission Trial Staff filed initial comments in support of the offer of settlement. No other comments were filed. On June 8, 2007, the presiding administrative law judge certified the offer of settlement to the Commission as uncontested.¹

2. The subject settlement is fair and reasonable, and in the public interest, and is hereby approved. The revised Reliability Must Run Agreement that is the subject of this proceeding will be amended effective December 12, 2006 and terminated effective June 1, 2007, as requested by the Settling Parties. The Commission’s approval of this settlement does not constitute approval of, or precedent regarding, any principle or issue in this proceeding. The applicable standard of review for the settlement is the “just and

reasonable” standard. The Commission retains the right to investigate the rates, terms and conditions under the just and reasonable and not unduly discriminatory or preferential standard of Section 206 of the Federal Power Act, 16 U.S.C. § 824e (2000).

3. Refunds will be paid by Bridgeport Energy, LLC, to ISO New England Inc. in accordance with Section 6 of the offer of settlement.
4. This order terminates Docket Nos. ER05-611-004, ER05-611-007 and ER05-611-008.
