ORDER APPROVING UNCONTESTED SETTLEMENT

(Issued June 30, 2008)

1. On June 11, 2008, Milford Power Company, LLC (Milford) on behalf of itself and ISO New England Inc., Connecticut Municipal Electric Energy Cooperative, Richard Blumenthal, Attorney General for the State of Connecticut, the Connecticut Department of Public Utility Control, and Northeast Utilities Service Company filed a settlement agreement resolving all of the issues in this proceeding concerning Milford's reliability must run agreement.
2. On June 16, 2008, Commission Trial Staff submitted comments in support of the settlement. No other comments were filed. On June 20, 2008, the settlement was certified to the Commission as uncontested.¹
3. The settlement is fair, reasonable and in the public interest and is hereby approved. The Commission's approval of this settlement does not constitute approval of, or precedent regarding, any principle or issue in this proceeding. The Commission retains the right to investigate the rates, terms and conditions under the just and reasonable and not unduly discriminatory or preferential standard of section 206 of the Federal Power Act, 16 U.S.C. § 824e (2000 & Supp. V 2005).
