Reference: Revisions to Internet Website Provisions

Ladies and Gentlemen:

1. On February 20, 2009, Chandeleur Pipe Line Company (Chandeleur) filed Second Revised Sheet No. 42 to its FERC Gas Tariff, Second Revised Volume No. 1, to revise the Internet website provisions set forth in section 7.7 of its General Terms and Conditions (GT&C), to be effective March 24, 2009. Chandeleur states, from time to time, it must perform maintenance on systems that support its Internet website. As a result, its website is sometimes temporarily out of service. Chandeleur states, in the past, whenever its website was temporarily out of service due to system upgrades, it has filed with the Commission a request to waive certain tariff provisions, Commission regulations, and NAESB¹ standards so it can continue transacting business with shippers via alternative methods. Chandeleur expresses concerns that, due to security reasons and the need for system integrity, it often cannot file its waiver request with the Commission early enough to allow the Commission time to notice and act on the filing before the system outage.

2. To remedy this concern, Chandeleur proposes to incorporate certain provisions into section 7.7 of its GT&C. Specifically, under its proposal, Chandeleur will use its best efforts to perform system maintenance in the evening so that shippers would still

have access to the website during business hours (6:00 a.m. through 10:00 p.m. Central Clock Time). However, Chandeaur proposes language stating that, should system upgrades result in its website being down during business hours, it will provide shippers with alternate methods of conducting business. Under these circumstances, Chandeaur will issue notice to shippers detailing the alternative means of conducting business, as well as the dates, times, and anticipated duration of the website outage. Chandeaur contends these provisions will afford its shippers as much flexibility as possible during website outages.

3. The Commission issued public notice of Chandeaur's filing on February 24, 2009. Interventions and protests were due as provided by section 154.210 of the Commission's regulations. Pursuant to Rule 214 (18 C.F.R. § 385.214 (2008)), all timely filed motions to intervene and any motions to intervene out-of-time filed before the issuance date of this order are granted. Granting late intervention at this stage of the proceeding will not disrupt this proceeding or place additional burdens on existing parties. No protests or adverse comments were filed.

4. We accept Chandeaur's Second Revised Sheet No. 42 to become effective March 24, 2009. This acceptance will allow Chandeaur to upgrade its Internet website without having the administrative burden of having to file waivers with the Commission to continue transacting business with shippers via alternative methods whenever its website is down. It will also provide shippers with additional flexibility during website outages.
