Reference: Limited Waiver Request

Ladies and Gentlemen:

1. On January 29, 2010, Kinder Morgan Interstate Gas Transmission LLC (KMIGT) filed a petition for a limited waiver of its FERC Gas Tariff to allow KMIGT to resolve an imbalance election request by Missouri Gas Energy (MGE) outside the timeframes allowed for in the tariff. Section 5.2(d) of Fourth Revised Sheet No. 17 of KMIGT's Rate Schedule FT states that shippers will have until the 17th Business Day of the month to access KMIGT's website to elect which imbalance resolution mechanism(s) they will use and the volumes associated with each mechanism.
2. On January 17, 2010, MGE sent timely notice to KMIGT electing to resolve its December 2009 imbalance by electing to trade imbalances to avoid the default cashout process. The email, however, was directed to a KMIGT employee's email account that is no longer active, which caused KMIGT's confirmation of the imbalance trade to be delayed one day, and therefore outside of the timeframe allowed in KMIGT's tariff. Accordingly, KMIGT requests a limited waiver of its tariff to allow MGE to resolve its December 2009 imbalance volumes one business day past the deadline, and thereby avoid the default cash-out

process. KMIGT notes that only this trade was affected by the error and that no other shippers will be disadvantaged by approval of the waiver.

3. Public notice of the filing was issued on February 2, 2010. Interventions and protests were due as provided in section 154.210 of the Commission's regulations (18 C.F.R. § 154.210 (2009)). Pursuant to Rule 214 (18 C.F.R. § 385.214 (2009)), all timely filed motions to intervene and any motion to intervene out-of-time filed before the issuance date of this order are granted. Granting late intervention at this stage of the proceeding will not disrupt the proceeding or place additional burdens on existing parties. No protests or adverse comments were filed.

4. For good cause shown, we grant KMIGT the requested limited waiver of its tariff to allow MGE to resolve its December 2009 imbalance volumes one business day past the deadline.
