Dear Ms. Walsh:

1. On July 3, 2012, you submitted a settlement agreement (Settlement) on behalf of American Transmission Company LLC; Midwest Independent Transmission System Operator, Inc. (MISO); and the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (Settling Parties). On July 23, 2012, Commission Trial Staff filed comments in support of the Settlement. No other comments were filed. On August 1, 2012, the settlement judge certified the uncontested Settlement to the Commission.
2. The Settlement resolves all issues concerning the *pro forma* Blackstart Resource Service Agreement and rate formula template set for hearing in *Midwest Independent Transmission System Operator, Inc.*, 137 FERC ¶ 61,166 (2011). The Settling Parties state that the Settlement renders moot the request for clarification filed by American Transmission Company LLC in Docket No. ER08-1486-001, and, if the Settlement is approved by the Commission as requested, American Transmission Company LLC will withdraw its request for clarification.
3. The Settlement includes a *pro forma* agreement that Settling Parties agree will be included as Attachment NN-ATCLLC to the MISO Open Access Transmission Tariff (OATT). No changes have been made to the Attachment NN-ATCLLC *pro forma* agreement from the version filed on September 13, 2011. The Settlement also includes

proposed revisions to the formula rate template that will be incorporated into the MISO OATT as MISO OATT Schedule 33-ATCLLC. The effective date of Attachment NN-ATCLLC and Schedule 33-ATCLLC is December 1, 2011.

4. The Settlement appears to be fair and reasonable and in the public interest, and is hereby approved. The Commission's approval of this Settlement does not constitute approval of, or precedent regarding, any principle or issue in this proceeding. The Commission retains the right to investigate the rates, terms, and conditions under the just and reasonable and not unduly discriminatory or preferential standard of section 206 of the Federal Power Act, 16 U.S.C. § 824e (2006).

5. This letter order terminates Docket Nos. ER11-4514-000 and ER11-4514-001.
