Dear Ms. Davies:

1. On February 29, 2008, the California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) filed, pursuant to Rule 212 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, 18 C.F.R. § 385.212 (2007), a Motion to Modify Effective Date of Tariff Sheets of the California Independent System Operator Corporation.
2. Specifically, the CAISO requested that the Commission modify the effective date of the tariff sheets contained in the CAISO's December 21, 2007 Fourth Replacement Version of FERC Electric Tariff (December 21 Filing).
3. In the December 21 Filing, the CAISO submitted tariff sheets bearing a proposed effective date of March 31, 2008. The CAISO submitted the March 31, 2008 effective date based on a presumed Market Redesign and Technology Upgrade (MRTU) implementation of March 31, 2008.
4. Due to delays in the implementation of the MRTU, the March 31, 2008 effective date is no longer applicable. Therefore, the CAISO requested that the March 31, 2008 effective date be modified and found to be no longer applicable. The CAISO also requested a waiver of section 35.3 of the Commission's regulations, 18 C.F.R. § 35.3 (2007), to permit the tariff sheets contained in the December 21 Filing to become effective more than 120 days after the date the December 21 Filing was submitted. This order grants the requested modification and the requested waiver.

The Commission orders:

(A) The March 31, 2008 effective date contained in the December 21 Filing is no longer applicable.

(B) The CAISO is granted a waiver of section 35.3 of the Commission's regulations, 18 C.F.R. § 35.3 (2007), to permit the tariff sheets contained in the December 21 Filing to become effective more than 120 days after the date the December 21 Filing was submitted.
