Dear Mr. Coher:

1. On December 21, 2010, you filed an Offer of Settlement (Settlement) on behalf of Southern California Edison Company (SoCal Edison) and Brea Power II LLC (Brea Power) in the above-referenced dockets. On January 10, 2011, the Commission Trial Staff filed initial comments in support of the Settlement. No other comments were filed. The Settlement Judge certified the Settlement to the Commission on January 24, 2011.²

¹ SoCal Edison filed the Offer of Settlement through the Commission's e-Tariff system in two dockets. As a result, Docket No. ER11-2458-000 was assigned to the Settlement provisions regarding the Large Generator Interconnection Agreement (LGIA) and Docket No. ER11-2461-000 was assigned to the Settlement provisions regarding the Project Tie-Line Facilities Agreement (Tie-Line). All further documents related to the Settlement should therefore reference these e-tariff dockets.

2. The Settlement resolves all issues set for hearing in Docket No. ER10-510-000, *et al.* The Settlement appears to be fair and reasonable and in the public interest, and is hereby approved.
3. The Commission's approval of the Settlement does not constitute approval of, or precedent regarding, any principle or issue involved in the above-captioned dockets. Paragraph 6 of the Settlement provides that the standard of review for changes to this Settlement will be the just and reasonable standard. The Commission retains the right to investigate the rates, terms, and conditions under the just and reasonable and not unduly discriminatory or preferential standard of section 206 of the Federal Power Act, 16 U.S.C. § 824e (2006).
4. The revised rate schedule provisions submitted in e-Tariff in Docket No. ER11-2461-000 reflect the Tie-Line language included in the Settlement. Therefore, in Docket No. ER11-2461-000 SoCal Edison has complied with *Electronic Tariff Filings*, Order No. 714, FERC Stats. & Regs. ¶ 31,276 (2008) and the rate schedule provisions are accepted. However, the revised tariff provisions submitted electronically in e-Tariff in Docket No. ER11-2458-000 are missing some text and therefore these revisions do not fully reflect the Settlement tariff provisions approved by this order. Therefore, we accept the LGIA provisions, but direct SoCal Edison to submit a compliance filing in Docket No. ER11-2458-000, within sixty days of the issuance of this letter order, to restore the missing text.
5. This letter order terminates Docket Nos. ER10-510-000, ER11-2458-000, and ER11-2461-000. A new subdocket will be assigned in Docket No. ER11-2458-000 upon receipt of the compliance filing to conform the LGIA e-Tariff text to that in the approved Settlement.
