Reference: Letter Order on Tariff Amendment Filing

Ladies and Gentlemen:

1. On August 17, 2012, Cadeville Gas Storage LLC (Cadeville) submitted revised *pro forma* tariff records<sup>1</sup> in the above-referenced proceeding to amend limited aspects of the *pro forma* tariff approved by the Commission in the order issued on August 10, 2010 (2010 Certificate Order).<sup>2</sup> Cadeville states that modifications to its Original *Pro Forma* Volume No. 1 required by the 2010 Certificate Order have not been made at this time and that it will make those required changes no earlier than 60 days before it goes into service.<sup>3</sup> As discussed below, the Commission approves Cadeville's proposed *pro forma* tariff changes.

2. Cadeville states it expects the facilities approved in the 2010 Certificate Order to be in service in early 2013 and it is proposing the *pro forma* tariff changes at this time in order to accommodate customer needs now being raised. Cadeville's proposed modification to its Original *Pro Forma* Volume No. 1 in the instant filing pertains only to

a change in pipeline operating pressures, as set forth in Section 6.11 of the General Terms and Conditions of the *pro forma* tariff, which Cadeville states are necessitated by prevailing pipeline pressures of the pipelines interconnecting with its storage facilities.<sup>4</sup> We find Cadeville's proposed modification to be acceptable and consistent with Commission policy. Therefore, we accept Cadeville's proposed revisions to its *pro forma* tariff.

3. Public notice of Cadeville's Filing was issued on September 27, 2012. Interventions and protests were due as provided in section 154.210 of the Commission's regulations.<sup>5</sup> Pursuant to Rule 214,<sup>6</sup> all timely filed motions to intervene and any unopposed motions to intervene out-of-time filed before the issuance date of this order are granted. No adverse comments or protests were filed.
