Dear Ms. Thomas:

1. On July 18, 2014, MIGC LLC (MIGC) made its annual tariff filing to revise its fuel retention and loss percentage factors (FL&U factors). The proposed tariff record¹ reflects a decrease of 0.28 percent in the proposed FL&U factor for all gas entering MIGC's system. MIGC requests waiver of the Commission's regulations and waiver of its tariff to permit an effective date of August 1, 2014 for its revised tariff record. As discussed below, the Commission waives the 30-day notice requirement and section 9.25 of MIGC's tariff and accepts MIGC's revised tariff record to be effective August 1, 2014.

2. Section 9.25 of MIGC's tariff provides that an updated FL&U factor will be filed no later than July 1 each year to be effective August 1. MIGC states that it inadvertently failed to file its revised tariff record by July 1; therefore, waiver of section 9.25 of its tariff and waiver of the 30 day notice period is required to permit an effective date of August 1, 2014. MIGC argues that good cause exists to grant the shortened notice period because no shippers will be prejudiced by a shortened notice period. MIGC states that its revised tariff record will benefit MIGC's shippers because it reflects a reduction in MIGC's FL&U factor, and that imposing a 30-day notice period will delay shippers' receipt of this rate reduction.

Public notice of MIGC's filing was issued on July 21, 2014. Interventions and protests were due as provided in section 154.210 of the Commission's regulations (18 C.F.R. § 154.210 (2014)). Pursuant to Rule 214 (18 C.F.R. § 385.214 (2014)) all timely filed motions to intervene and any unopposed motion to intervene out-of-time filed before the issuance date of this order are granted. Granting late intervention at this stage of the proceeding will not disrupt the proceeding or place additional burdens on existing parties. No protests or adverse comments were filed.

3. The Commission grants waiver of the 30-day notice period and section 9.25 of MIGC's tariff, and accepts the revised tariff record to be effective August 1, 2014.
