**INFORMATION REQUEST**

1. Jordan Cove should file documentation of its recent consultations with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the Southwest Oregon Regional Airport pertaining to the five Notices of Presumed Hazards.
2. Jordan Cove should:
  - a. indicate how it proposes to resolve the five Notices of Presumed Hazards;
  - b. provide the results of any additional aeronautical studies; and
  - c. provide any official determinations made by the FAA concerning the proposed LNG terminal and LNG vessels.
3. Jordan Cove should explain whether or not it is feasible for the LNG storage tanks, amine towers, and LNG vessels to be lessened in height to mitigate any hazards to and from aircraft serving the Southwest Oregon Regional Airport, including the use of smaller capacity LNG storage tanks and LNG vessels as proposed in the original import terminal. If it is not feasible, Jordan Cove should explain what, if any, mitigation could be implemented to prevent significant impacts to the operation of the Southwest Oregon Regional Airport.
4. Jordan Cove should explain whether or not it is feasible for the LNG storage tanks and LNG vessels to be designed to withstand impact from aircraft serving the Southwest Oregon Regional Airport, including impact from the largest aircraft. If it is not feasible, Jordan Cove should explain what, if any, mitigation could be implemented to prevent significant impacts from aircraft to the safety of the LNG terminal.
