Dear Ms. Owen:

On June 25, 2015, Gulf South Pipeline Company, LP (Gulf South) filed a tariff record<sup>1</sup> which contains a negotiated rate letter agreement with Texla Energy Management, Inc. for service under Rate Schedule ITS. Gulf South requests the tariff record become effective June 25, 2015. Waiver of the Commission's 30-day notice requirement is granted and the tariff record listed in footnote No. 1 is accepted to become effective June 25, 2015, as proposed.

Public notice of the filing was issued on June 26, 2015. Interventions and protests were due as provided in section 154.210 of the Commission's regulations (18 C.F.R. § 154.210 (2014)). Pursuant to Rule 214 (18 C.F.R. § 385.214 (2014)), all timely filed motions to intervene and any unopposed motion to intervene out-of-time filed before the issuance date of this order are granted. Granting late intervention at this stage of the proceeding will not disrupt the proceeding or place additional burdens on existing parties. No protests or adverse comments were filed.

This acceptance for filing shall not be construed as a waiver of the requirements of

section 7 of the Natural Gas Act, as amended; nor shall it be construed as constituting approval of the referenced filing or of any rate, charge, classification, or any rule, regulation, or practice affecting such rate or service contained in your tariff; nor shall such acceptance be deemed as recognition of any claimed contractual right or obligation associated therewith; and such acceptance is without prejudice to any findings or orders which have been or may hereafter be made by the Commission in any proceeding now pending or hereafter instituted by or against your company.

This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713 (2014).
