Dear Ms. Gianvecchio and Mr. Brown:

1. On November 4, 2015, C.P. Crane LLC (CP Crane) made an informational filing (Informational Filing), pursuant to Schedule 2 of the PJM Interconnection, L.L.C. Open Access Transmission Tariff regarding CP Crane's Reactive Supply and Voltage Control from Generation Sources Service (Reactive Service).<sup>1</sup> Also on November 4, 2015, CP Crane filed its existing rate for Reactive Service.<sup>2</sup> On December 29, 2015, the Commission issued an order accepting CP Crane's Reactive Service rate schedule, instituting a Federal Power Act (FPA) section 206 proceeding in Docket No. EL16-21-000, and establishing hearing and settlement judge procedures.<sup>3</sup>

2. On April 27, 2016, you filed an Offer of Settlement in Docket No. EL16-21-000 on behalf of CP Crane.<sup>4</sup> On May 13, 2016, Commission Trial Staff filed initial comments in support of the Settlement. No other comments were filed. On June 2, 2016, the settlement judge certified the Offer of Settlement to the Commission as uncontested.

3. The Settlement provides that

[n]othing in this Offer of Settlement is intended to affect the Commission's authority, pursuant to Section 205 of the Federal Power Act or otherwise, to review, accept (with or without conditions or modifications) or reject this Offer of Settlement, or the legal standard applicable to the exercise of such authority. Once approved, any modification of the settlement would be governed by the "just and reasonable" standard.<sup>5</sup>

4. The Offer of Settlement appears to be fair, reasonable, and in the public interest and is hereby approved. The Commission's approval of this Settlement Agreement does not constitute approval of, or precedent regarding, any principle or issue in this proceeding.

5. CP Crane is directed to file revised tariff records in eTariff format, within 30 days of the date of this order, to reflect the Commission's action in this order.<sup>6</sup>

6. This letter order terminates Docket Nos. ER16-259-000, ER16-332-000, and EL16-21-000.
