ORDER VACATING CERTIFICATE AUTHORIZATION IN PART

(Issued June 30, 2016)

1. On April 29, 2016, the Commission authorized UGI Sunbury, LLC (Sunbury) under section 7(c) of the Natural Gas Act (NGA)¹ to construct and operate the Sunbury Pipeline Project to provide new service to a new electric generation facility and to local gas distribution markets in central Pennsylvania.² The Certificate Order authorized Sunbury to construct and operate the Sunbury Pipeline Project, including the UGI Penn Delivery Station near Milepost 30 in Point Township, Northumberland County, Pennsylvania.³

2. On May 26, 2016, Sunbury filed a pleading explaining that the UGI Penn Delivery Station, intended to accommodate service to firm shipper UGI Energy Services, LLC, is no longer needed and that vacating the certificate authorization to construct the UGI Penn Delivery Station will not affect the delivery volume agreed to in the precedent agreement between Sunbury and UGI Energy Services, LLC. Therefore, Sunbury requests that the Commission vacate its certificate authority to construct the UGI Penn Delivery Station.

³ The Certificate Order also authorized Sunbury to construct 34.4 miles of 20-inch diameter pipeline, receiving and delivery stations, and associated facilities. For a further description of the other approved facilities, see Certificate Order, 155 FERC ¶ 61,115 at PP 4-5.

3. In view of the above circumstances, the Commission will vacate Sunbury's certificate authorization, in part, as requested.⁴

The Commission orders:

The certificate authorization issued to UGI Sunbury, LLC on April 29, 2016 in Docket No. CP15-525-000 is vacated, in part, as discussed above.

⁴ On May 27, 2016, Commission staff approved Sunbury's request to repurpose the land authorized for construction of the UGI Penn Delivery Station as temporary construction workspace and to relocate mainline valve 2, noting that Sunbury filed separately to vacate the construction of the UGI PNG delivery point interconnect facility.
