Dear Mr. Jacob:

The Division of Financial Audits in the Office of Market Oversight and Investigations (OMOI) of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) is commencing an audit to determine Edison Mission Marketing & Trading, Inc.'s compliance with FERC rules and regulations. The primary focus of the audit includes, but is not limited to, compliance with the requirements of Order No. 2001.¹

The primary audit objective is to determine compliance with FERC Electric Quarterly Report filing requirements under 18 C.F.R. § 35.10b (2004). We also will determine compliance with other FERC rules and regulations including, but not limited to, interlocking directorate requirements under Section 305 of the Federal Power Act, 16 U.S.C. § 825(b) (2000). The audit will cover the period January 1, 2004, to present.

Enclosed is a non-public Data Request, Attachment A, to facilitate our review. Please provide responses to the Data Request on or before May 11, 2005 to Nicholas Coughlin, Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, 888 First Street, N.E., Room 5H-03, Washington, D.C. 20426.

Section 301(b) of the Federal Power Act, 16 U.S.C. § 825(b) (2000) allows the audit team to keep copies of any accounts, records, or memoranda that pertain to the audit; requires companies to furnish, within reasonable time frames, any information which the Commission may require; and requires companies to grant agents of the Commission free access to its property, accounts, records and memoranda. Additionally, Section 301(b) of the Federal Power Act prohibits any employee of the Commission from divulging any information obtained during the audit, except as directed by the Commission or by a court.
