ORDER APPROVING UNCONTESTED SETTLEMENT

(Issued December 29, 2005)

1. On October 26, 2005, Southern California Edison Company (SoCal Edison) filed an Offer of Settlement (Settlement) to resolve all issues in the above-referenced dockets with Cities of Anaheim, Azusa, Banning, Colton, and Riverside, California. Initial comments in support of the Settlement were filed by the Commission Trial Staff on November 14, 2005. No other comments were filed. On November 17, 2005, the Presiding Administrative Law Judge certified the Settlement to the Commission as uncontested.
2. The Settlement resolves issues related to SoCal Edison's revisions to its Wholesale Distribution Access Tariff (WDAT), its proposed WDAT Large Generator Interconnection Procedures (LGIP), and its proposed Large Generator Interconnection Agreement (LGIA).¹ Specifically, the Settlement provides for language changes in both SoCal Edison's WDAT LGIP and LGIA. The definition of System Protection Facilities is modified to replace the term "other portions of the Distribution Provider's electric system" with the term "the ISO Controlled Grid."
3. The Settlement is in the public interest and is hereby approved. The rate schedule sheets submitted as part of the Settlement are in compliance with Order 614.² The rate

schedules are hereby accepted for filing and made effective as specified in the Settlement. The Commission's approval of this settlement does not constitute approval of, or precedent regarding any principle or issue in this proceeding.

4. The Commission retains the right to investigate the rates, terms and conditions under the just and reasonable and not unduly discriminatory or preferential standard of section 206 of the Federal Power Act, 16 U.S.C. § 824e (2004).

5. This order terminates Docket Nos. ER04-435-010, ER04-435-012, and ER05-612-000.
