NOTICE OF A SITE VISIT AND PUBLIC MEETINGS
TO RECEIVE ENVIRONMENTAL COMMENTS ON
THE PROPOSED
EAST TEXAS EXPANSION PROJECT

(June 7, 2006)

The staff of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (Staff) will visit the proposed East Texas Expansion Project pipeline route on June 22, 2006. Interested individuals are invited to accompany Staff on this visit; however, participants must provide their own transportation. The site visit will begin at the Residence Inn by Marriott located at 4960 Millhaven Road, Monroe, LA at 8:00 am (CDT).

In addition, Staff will hold two public meetings to receive environmental comments on the proposed East Texas Expansion Project. These meetings are an opportunity for landowners and concerned citizens to offer comments on the environmental issues they believe should be addressed in our Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). The EIS will ultimately be used by the Commission in its decision-making process to determine whether or not to authorize the proposed project.

In order to facilitate the review of multiple projects in the area, these public meetings will be conducted jointly with the Draft EIS comment meetings for the proposed Carthage to Perryville Project (FERC Docket No. CP06-85-000). Individuals wishing to comment on either or both projects are invited to attend these public scoping meetings which will be held, **starting at 7:00 pm (CDT)**, as follows:
