ORDER DIRECTING RELEASE OF INFORMATION
UNDER A PROTECTIVE AGREEMENT

(Issued July 12, 2006)

1. In letters dated February 23 and March 15, 2006, the County of Suffolk, New York (Suffolk) requested, under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA),¹ certain non-public information in the application filed by Broadwater Energy LLC and Broadwater Pipeline LLC (Broadwater) to site, construct, and operate an offshore liquefied natural gas (LNG) import terminal and related pipeline facilities. As discussed below, Suffolk, an intervenor in the proceeding,² may obtain access to such information under a protective agreement.

I. Background

2. On January 30, 2006, Broadwater filed an application requesting authorization to construct and operate an offshore LNG receiving terminal in Long Island Sound approximately nine miles from the shore of Long Island in New York state waters. Additionally, Broadwater proposes to construct and operate a 30-inch, 22-mile subsea lateral pipeline to interconnect with an existing interstate pipeline.

3. Suffolk filed a FOIA request seeking certain non-public information filed in Broadwater's application. While some of the requested information was released, Suffolk's request as it pertained to certain capital cost, cultural resource, and carrier route information and engineering data, plans, and schematics of the proposed facilities was denied.³

II. Discussion

4. The Commission believes that Suffolk and any other party to the proceeding should be able to obtain access as necessary to information filed under section 388.112 of the Commission's regulations for which special treatment has been requested under a protective agreement.⁴ While there is a model protective order on the Commission's website,⁵ protective agreements should be drafted in light of the facts in a particular case. The goal is "to issue the least restrictive order that will accomplish the purpose of protecting against the harm of disclosure."⁶ The burden is on the party seeking to safeguard this information to show that the protective agreement does not adequately protect its interests.⁷

5. Accordingly, we hereby order Broadwater to enter into a protective agreement consistent with the discussion above and to provide Suffolk with the non-public information it has requested, within 15 days of the date of this order. Should the parties desire additional assistance, they may make use of the Commission's designated on-call

settlement judge. However, the use of such a procedure shall not extend the 15-day deadline for production of the requested material.

The Commission orders:

Within 15 days after the issuance of this order, Broadwater shall provide the requested information to Suffolk under the terms of an executed protective agreement. A copy of the executed agreement shall be filed with the Commission.
