Dear Counsel:

On August 29, 2008, SFPP, L.P., BP West Coast Products, LLC, and ExxonMobil Oil Corporation (collectively the Parties) filed an Offer of Settlement in the above-referenced proceeding for approval under Rule 602. Included therein were Attachments B and C, which were, respectively, a motion for permission to withdraw complaints pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.206(j) and a joint conditional notice of withdrawal of complaints pursuant to the Energy Policy Act of 1992. Initial comments in support of the Settlement Agreement were filed by the Commission's Trial Staff on September 18, 2008. No other comments were filed. On September 29, 2008, the Offer of Settlement was certified to the Commission as uncontested.

2. The Settlement is fair and reasonable and in the public interest, and is hereby approved. The Commission's approval of the Settlement does not constitute approval of, or precedent regarding, any principal or issue in these proceedings.

3. Payments and adjustments shall be made pursuant to the Settlement. Upon the Commission's receipt of SFPP, L.P.'s written certification that it has made the Settlement payments, the withdrawal of the complaints in Docket Nos. OR07-8-000, OR07-8-001, and OR07-11-000 shall become effective, and those dockets shall be terminated.
