ORDER ACCEPTING TARIFFS

(Issued February 3, 2012)

1. On January 6, 2012, Dixie Pipeline Company LLC (Dixie LLC) filed in Docket No. IS12-106-000 the following FERC Numbers:

- FERC No. 1.0.0, Adoption Notice – Effective January 6, 2012
- FERC No. 2.0.0, (Propane – Rules and Regulations) – Effective February 6, 2012
- FERC No. 3.0.0, (Propane – Rates) – Effective February 6, 2012
- FERC No. 4.0.0 (Ethane – Rates, Rules and Regulations) – Effective February 6, 2011.¹
- FERC No. 5.0.0, (Refinery Grade Propylene (RGP) – Rates Rules and Regulations) – Effective February 6, 2012

2. Dixie LLC states that it makes the filing to implement its name change from Dixie Pipeline Company (Dixie) to Dixie Pipeline Company LLC, effective December 31, 2011, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 341.6(c) (2011) of the Commission's

regulations regarding tariff adoption rules in the case of a change in name. Dixie LLC states that all rates and routing, rules, and regulations have been brought forward unchanged unless otherwise indicated within each tariff.

3. On January 20, 2012, Dow Hydrocarbons and Resources LLC (Dow) filed a motion for leave to intervene and protest. Dow asserts that Dixie LLC filed FERC No. 1.0.0 to adopt and make its own all of Dixie's tariff publications. Further, states Dow, Dixie LLC filed FERC No. 2.0.0 to cancel FERC 99.3.0. According to Dow, Item 70 of FERC No. 2.0.0 contains the revised prorationing policy for injection capacity that the Commission accepted and suspended in an order issued January 13, 2012, in Docket No. IS12-88-000. Dow anticipates that Dixie LLC will file a suspension supplement in accordance with the requirements of 18 C.F.R. § 341.4(f) (2011). However, Dow states that, as of the date of its motion to intervene and protest, Dixie LLC had not yet filed the suspension supplement; therefore, out of an abundance of caution, Dow protests the inclusion of the suspended language in Item 70 of FERC No. 2.0.0.

4. On January 6, 2012, Dixie filed in Docket No. IS12-107-000 the following FERC Numbers to be effective January 6, 2012:

- FERC No. 99.2.0 (Adoption Supplement) cancels FERC No. 99.1.0
- FERC No. 100.4.0 (Adoption Supplement) cancels FERC No. 100.3.0
- FERC No. 101.2.0 (Adoption Supplement) cancels FERC No. 101.1.0
- FERC No. 102.2.0 (Adoption Supplement) cancels FERC No. 102.1.0

5. Dixie states that it makes the filing to implement its name change from Dixie Pipeline Company to Dixie Pipeline Company LLC, effective December 31, 2011, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 341.6(c) (2011) of the Commission's regulations regarding tariff adoption rules in the case of a change in name.

6. On January 20, 2012, Dow filed a motion for leave to intervene and a protest. In that filing, Dow contends that Dixie's FERC No. 99.2.0 (Adoption Supplement) to cancel FERC No. 99.1.0, effective December 31, 2012, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 341.6(c) (2011). According to Dow, Item 70 of FERC No. 99.2.0 contains the revised prorationing policy for injection capacity that the Commission accepted and suspended in an order issued January 13, 2012, in Docket No. IS12-88-000. Dow anticipates that Dixie LLC will file a suspension supplement in accordance with the requirements of 18 C.F.R. § 341.4(f) (2011). However, Dow states that, as of the date of its motion to intervene and protest, Dixie LLC had not yet made that filing; therefore, out of an abundance of caution, Dow protests the inclusion of the suspended language in Item 70 of FERC No. 99.2.0.

7. On January 9, 2012, Dixie filed in Docket No. IS12-108-000 the following FERC Numbers to be effective February 6, 2012:

- FERC No. 99.3.0, (Cancellation Notice) cancels FERC No. 99.2.0
- FERC No. 100.5.0, (Cancellation Notice) cancels FERC No. 100.4.0
- FERC No. 101.3.0, (Cancellation Notice) cancels FERC No. 101.2.0
- FERC No. 102.3.0, (Cancellation Notice) cancels 102.2.0

8. Dixie states that it makes the filing to implement its name change from Dixie Pipeline Company to Dixie Pipeline Company LLC, effective December 31, 2011, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 341.6(c) (2011) of the Commission's regulations regarding tariff adoption rules in the case of a change in name. Dixie adds that, for further rules and regulations information, see Dixie Pipeline Company LLC FERC Tariff Nos. 2.0.0 (Propane - Rules and Regulations), 3.0.0 (Propane – Rates), 4.0.0 (Ethane – Rates, Rules and Regulations), and 5.0.0 (Refinery Grade Propylene (RGP) – Rates, Rules, and Regulations).

9. On January 20, 2012, Dow filed a motion for leave to intervene and a protest. In that filing, Dow cites the filings in Docket Nos. IS12-106-000 and IS12-107-000 and notes that in Docket No. IS12-108-000, Dixie includes FERC No. 99.3.0 (Cancellation Notice) to cancel FERC No. 99.2.0. Further, states Dow, the filing in Docket No. IS12-106 includes Dixie LLC's FERC No. 2.0.0 to cancel FERC No. 99.3.0 effective February 6, 2012. According to Dow, Item 70 of FERC No. 2.0.0 also contains the revised prorationing policy for injection capacity that the Commission accepted and suspended in an order issued January 13, 2012, in Docket No. IS12-88-000. Dow anticipates that Dixie LLC will file a suspension supplement in accordance with the requirements of 18 C.F.R. § 341.4(f) (2011). However, Dow states that, as of the date of its motion to intervene and protest, Dixie LLC had not yet made that filing; therefore, out of an abundance of caution, Dow protests the inclusion of the suspended language in Item 70 of FERC No. 2.0.0.

10. On January 25, 2012, Dixie LLC filed the following in Docket No. IS12-130-000 to become effective February 6, 2012:

FERC Tariff No. 2.1.0 (Cancels FERC Tariff No. 2.0.0)
which suspends Dixie Pipeline Company's FERC Tariff
No. 99.1.0.

11. Dixie LLC states that FERC Tariff No. 2.1.0 is issued to reflect changes in Item 70 (Proration) as a result of the Commission's order in Docket IS-12-88-000. Dixie LLC states that Paragraph B – (1) reflects the injection language that is currently in effect until August 16, 2012, or further order of the Commission.

12. Dixie's filing in Docket No. IS12-130-000 resolves the concern raised in Dow's protests in Docket Nos. IS12-106-000, IS12-107-000, and IS12-108-000. Accordingly, the Commission dismisses Dow's protests as moot and accepts the tariff numbers reflected in the Dixie/Dixie LLC filings in those three docket numbers.

The Commission orders:

(A) The following tariff numbers are accepted to be effective as of February 6, 2012, unless otherwise indicated:

- FERC No. 1.0.0, Adoption Notice – Effective January 6, 2012
- FERC No. 2.0.0, (Propane – Rules and Regulations)
- FERC No. 3.0.0, (Propane – Rates)
- FERC No. 5.0.0, (Refinery Grade Propylene (RGP) – Rates Rules and Regulations)
- FERC No. 99.2.0 (Adoption Supplement) cancels FERC No. 99.1.0 – Effective January 6, 2012
- FERC No. 100.4.0 (Adoption Supplement) cancels FERC No. 100.3.0 – Effective January 6, 2012
- FERC No. 101.2.0 (Adoption Supplement) cancels FERC No. 101.1.0 – Effective January 6, 2012
- FERC No. 102.2.0 (Adoption Supplement) cancels FERC No. 102.1.0 – Effective January 6, 2012
- FERC No. 99.3.0, (Cancellation Notice) cancels FERC No. 99.2.0
- FERC No. 100.5.0, (Cancellation Notice) cancels FERC No. 100.4.0
- FERC No. 101.3.0, (Cancellation Notice) cancels FERC No. 101.2.0
- FERC No. 102.3.0, (Cancellation Notice) cancels FERC No. 102.2.0

(B) FERC No. 4.0.0 (Ethane – Rates, Rules and Regulations) is accepted to become effective February 6, 2012, subject to Dixie LLC filing a corrected tariff within 10 days of the date of issuance of this order to change the year from 2011 to 2012.
