Twenty-third Report to Congress on the Alaska Pipeline

I. Executive Summary

The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (Commission) submits this report pursuant to section 1810 of the Energy Policy Act of 2005 (EPAct 2005).¹ Section 1810 of EPAct 2005 requires that the Commission submit to Congress semi-annual reports describing the progress made in licensing and constructing an Alaska natural gas pipeline and any impediments thereto.

This report provides an update from the Commission's Twenty-second Report, submitted in August 2016. That report highlighted the termination of Docket No. PF09-11-000 by TransCanada Alaska Company, LLC (TC Alaska) and the Office of the Federal Coordinator for Alaska Natural Gas Transportation Projects.

II. Status Report

As stated in the previous report, at TC Alaska's request, the Commission terminated the prefile review process for the Alaska Pipeline Project in Docket No. PF09-11-000. The Commission staff has no progress to report.
